Women and children in the Middle East and Eastern Europe, should not be forced to wait a day longer for fair treatment and decent well-being. However, at the current trajectory, they will have to wait until the year 2157. It is imperative for policy and decision makers, programme makers and funders and all of humanity to speed up progress from this glacial pace.

It is time for equality. It is time for answers:

- Why do gender equity and women's empowerment continue to be non-negotiable?
- How are they inextricably linked to the next generation?
- What new pathway is mapped out for all those with the responsibility, means and will to ensure the needed change is achieved?

To inform the dialogue and critical pathway, World Vision's recent study reveals striking findings from 10 contexts across MEER (Middle East and Eastern Europe Region), shedding the light on women empowerment status, along with their children's well-being indicators and the intrinsic link between the two. It is the first study to holistically study the connection between women empowerment and child well-being indicators, with results of a critical importance for INGOs, UN and academia.

Therefore, on 2 March 2022, World Vision in Middle East and Eastern Europe will launch the report: **Empowered Women, Empowered Children**, bringing together an esteemed panel - representatives of UN agencies, donors and peer INGOs, with the objective to accelerate the discussion around the importance of women's empowerment in the context of the Humanitarian-Development-Peace Nexus agenda.

This is the essential discussion for all advocates for the rights of women and the wellbeing of children.
